

Community Based Therapist



Qualifications/Requirements:

Therapist position requires a Master's Degree in Psychology, Counseling, Social Work or other Human Services related field through a CACREP or CESW accredited school or have proof of educational equivalency AND **must be licensed through DORA as LPC, LCSW, LMFT** or comparable. Addictions counseling, education or certification a plus. Bilingual a plus.

1-3 years experience providing clinical services to adolescents and their families who have experienced sexual trauma or working with survivors of human trafficking. Advanced understanding of trauma-informed, strength's based care required. Demonstrated history of working with culturally diverse populations.

Schedule: Full-Time 40 hours a week Tuesday-Saturday with variable shifts, may include some Sundays and holidays if needed.

Responsibilities/ Job Duties:

- Therapist/Case Manager provides trauma-informed, survivor-centered clinical support to 14-18 year-old youth enrolled in the Community Based Program
- Maintains a case load of 10-12 clients.
- Screen referrals and conduct intake/admissions for new placements along with completing the intake assessment within 7 days of placement.
- Provide assessment, diagnosis, case conceptualization, treatment planning, and coordinating with a team of professionals outside of the agency.
- Conducts individual, family and group therapy with residents according to individual treatment plans and maintains caseload as assigned by Supervisor. This will include community and home based family therapy.
- Coordinates with the referring agencies, community contacts, family, legal system, and other professionals involved in the client's treatment. Meets monthly to discuss progress in the program.
- Maintains timely and quality documentation of progress notes, admission paperwork, and monthly reports in compliance with agency contracts.
- Complies with rules and regulations regarding ongoing review of clinical caseload in order to meet all program requirements for youth's care.
- Participates in weekly supervision with Supervisor.
- Maintain client files according to policy requirements.
- Facilitates referrals to other levels of care by coordinating with the client, family members, and all other professionals involved in the client's care team Extended Hands of Hope.
- Consults with the community based staff weekly regarding clinical issues and helps direct the delivery of trauma-informed interventions with individual clients. Identifying and assisting in training as needed for staff, interns, and volunteers.
- Provides crisis management on an as needed basis.
- Complete any other responsibilities or duties assigned by Supervisor to support individualized treatment planning and case-management needs within the program.
- Must be a reliable self-starter who is flexible and able to manage time effectively.
